Keele University Pupil Survey 2004 Simplified Analysis together with 2002 responses

This survey was carried out in October 2004. Three hundred and fifty five surveys were completed in the ratio of 25% of each year group including sixth form. Three hundred and forty could be analysed.

In the following analysis the first COLUMN RELATES TO THE BENTON PARK RESPONSE IN 2002. The second column is the database average of 1500 schools in 2002. COLUMN THREE IS THE BENTON PARK RESPONSE IN OCTOBER 2004 and column four is the database average of almost 2000 schools in October 2004.
